Day 1. African Sovereign Solutions

Concept Note



GLF Nairobi 2023 Hybrid Conference gathers key stakeholders to shape the global conversation ahead of the UN Climate Change Conference COP28. It is an opportunity for all to call for action on crucial issues affecting humans, biodiversity, and the planet.

Africa boasts an abundance of natural resources, including lush forests, vast rivers, and fertile soil that sustain the livelihoods of its diverse communities. But the swift degradation of its unique landscapes aggravated by climatic and non-climatic factors poses a significant threat to the continent's ability to create a prosperous and sustainable future for generations to come.

The Sixth Assessment Report of the

Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change has brought to light the devastating impact of weather and climate extremes, which are projected to cause impacts on ecosystem, biodiversity and communities, including acute food and water insecurity globally, but with more severe impacts to vulnerable groups such as women, elderly Indigenous Peoples and local communities, small-scale food producers, and low-income households across Africa. That's on top of poor land management practices, biodiversity loss, neo-colonial policies, compounded and exacerbated by climate change that have already resulted in the degradation of 65 percent of Africa's productive land and the desertification of 45 percent of its total land area. <u>UNEP's Adaptation Gap Report</u> (2022) projects an increase in adaptation needs and a widening finance gap which may put the world, especially developing nations, at a high vulnerability risk in the coming years.

This confluence of events triggers migration movement of rural population putting continuous strain on the environment particularly wood, land, and water resources. Communities are increasingly challenged with shrinking of productive lands for food and livelihoods. Vulnerable groups without access to arable land, relying on wild products or open grazing grounds face severe threats.

Despite progressive legislation enacted in recent years, women still <u>continue to be</u> marginalized and discriminated with regard to access to land and a shrinking natural resources base.

But there's hope in sovereign African solutions that empower local communities, landowners, and custodians to restore landscapes, create jobs, secure livelihoods, and strengthen food systems.



Welcome to GLF Nairobi 2023 Day 1: African Sovereign solutions

The GLF Nairobi 2023 conference will gather thousands of women leaders, Indigenous Peoples and local communities, smallholder farmers, youth activists, frontline actors, scientists, innovators, policymakers, and financiers who collectively have the vision, creativity, and knowledge to drive holistic, African-led solutions for sustainable food systems and promising livelihood prospects for the rural population. To be held on 11 October 2023, this hybrid conference will unite actors at the Center for International Forestry Research and World Agroforestry (CIFOR-ICRAF) Headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya, local watch parties across the continent, and digital participants worldwide to strengthen global partnerships that truly deliver results.

Agenda 2063 of the African Union prioritizes the Africa that Africans want and commits to preserving at least 17 percent of terrestrial and inland water and 10 percent of coastal and marine areas, while supporting 30 percent of farmers, fisher people, and pastoralists to practice climate resilient production systems. Prioritizing African solutions towards the restoration of Africa's degraded landscapes gives its people an opportunity to secure their livelihoods, access to finance, advocate for the rights of women and Indigenous Peoples and – most importantly – produce food for their social and economic wellbeing.

GLF Nairobi day 2: Climate Survival Guide on October 12th, and in honor of GLF's 10-year anniversary and CIFOR's 30-year anniversary, GLF Nairobi 2023 will deliver a vision where African communities have ownership for the well-being of their landscapes, amidst the backdrop of biodiversity loss, broken food systems, and the climate crisis. By illustrating sovereign solutions to African issues by African communities, the event will offer a dynamic platform for connecting with the local and global champions, traditional knowledge, and cutting-edge science that is necessary to amplify the impact and potential of locally-led solutions for the most pressing global challenges. The one-day conference will be packed with plenaries, interactive sessions, networking opportunities, the latest research, and live community watch parties from different locations across the continent.

Day 1 of the conference builds upon existing efforts to prioritize Africa's people and their need for change through their sovereign solutions, whereas day 2 focuses on climate, connecting African priorities and experiences to global climate, biodiversity and food resilience action. GLF Nairobi 2023 broadly seeks to:

- Convene and engage a diverse, actionoriented stakeholder group (innovators, scientists, policymakers, civil society organizations, youth activists, grassroots actors, financiers, entrepreneurs, and farmers) working to catalyze action and partnerships for the benefit of the African continent
- Provide a dynamic platform for collaboration, sharing expertise, and showcasing the top locally led solutions across Africa
- Facilitate learning, knowledge sharing, and matchmaking between diverse stakeholders

The primary themes and topics will be detailed and refined through a GLF Africa Regional Knowledge Committee consisting of Charter

Members and partner focal points. The agenda will feature interactive technical sessions sharing best practices, press conferences launching new campaigns and tools, structured networking sessions, and cultural exhibitions, across the following themes:

- Fostering rural development and green jobs through restoration enterprises (rural development, youth, jobs, biodiversity)
- Implementing local action through naturebased solutions to address humanitarian challenges of migration, conflict, aid, tenure insecurity and water scarcity
- Women as champions for restoring and managing landscapes for sustainable food systems in Africa (rights, agroecology, agrobiodiversity, agroforestry systems (including Agrosilvopastoral, Silvopastoral, and Agrosilvicultural)
- Tenure and rights for equitable access to and ownership of natural resources including land.
- Access to finance for restoration and resilience in Africa
- Sovereign solutions for restoring land
- Youth as drivers of the future resilient landscapes and livelihoods – unlocking the digital space.

Road to GLF Nairobi 2023

The GLF Nairobi 2023 Hybrid Conference will be the highlight of the GLF's Road to GLF Nairobi campaign to catalyze community-led local action and showcase human stories on the ground. We will organize the following activities with stakeholders to shape compelling pathways for action:

- GLFx Africa Chapter Summit, 19–21 June: A 3-day workshop in collaboration with the Robert Bosch Foundation, will bring together all GLFx Community-based chapters working in Africa to connect, share experiences, challenges, learn and dream together on upcoming activities to support community-led action toward more sustainable landscapes.
- Finance for Nature Digital Forum: Investing in Equitable Futures, 13 July: This Digital Forum will explore how to increase funding for the local communities in Latin America and the Caribbean – and how to promote equitable distribution of resources in these contexts.
- **Restoration Education Summit 2023:** This Summit will drive discussions for the implementation of a transdisciplinary curricula for restoration. By bridging practicebased, competence-based education with principles such as flexible assessment and life-long learning, the GLF partnership hopes to transform on-the-ground restoration education, and create seasoned landscape professionals to lead the way across the restoration sector. The curricula for restoration will be co-designed by a pan-African network of universities, the International Union Forest Research Organizations, Wageningen Centre for Development, and Wageningen University and Research.
- Activities by the Youth in Landscapes Initiative
 - Regional Digital Dialogues: In summer 2023, a series of digital interactive dialogues will shed light on and elevate action priorities for specific topics around climate justice and relevant policy for the local communities in Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean and Asia-Pacific.





- Landscape Leadership Workshop: The flagship learning program of the Youth in Landscapes Initiative (YIL) will take place in person during the week leading to GLF Nairobi 2023. Students and young professionals from across the African continent will have the opportunity to strengthen different skills and explore the landscape approach in the context of their own landscape, with a long-term goal of becoming landscape leaders.
- Special GLF Live series on GLF Nairobi 2023: Thought leaders and local actors will highlight solutions crucial to a resilient future through a special GLF Live series leading up to and after the conference.
